The IRFU, RFU, SRU and WRU have worked together to provide this guide for clubs, schools, colleges, universities, representative and other community rugby teams playing across Home Union borders, in regular fixtures or on tour.

As is currently the case, **all matches will be played to the Laws of the host Union**. The aim of this guide is to help teams to understand any headline differences and prepare for the new Tackle Height DLVs to which they will be playing in another country.

The DLV applies to tackles in open play only.
